INTRODUCTION TO MERIT BADGES AT CAMP FRONTIER

(To be shared with each Scout taking a merit badge at camp.)

- ◆ Obtain and read the merit badge pamphlet(s) prior to coming to camp.
- ◆ Get a *signed* merit badge form from your Scoutmaster for each merit badge you are taking. It is your admission ticket to your first session on Monday.
- ◆ Your staff counselor will help you learn and do the things that are required.
- ◆ Some requirements must be completed prior to coming to camp.
- ◆ When the counselor is satisfied that you have met each requirement, he/she will sign your form and return it to your Scoutmaster on Saturday morning.
- ◆ Partial completions will also be noted on the form.
- ◆ You are expected to meet the requirements as they are stated—no more and no less. You are expected to do exactly what is stated in the requirements. If it says 'show' or 'demonstrate', that is what you must do. Just telling about it isn't enough. The same things hold true for such words as 'make', 'list', 'in the field', and 'collect', 'identify' and 'label'.
